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# How does an Orthodontic Appliance Work?

Orthodontic Appliances have 3 Key Components:

- The attachment or bracket is bonded onto the tooth surface and guides the tooth to its ideal position by the end of treatment.
- The metallic archwire is inserted into the attachment and gently coaxes the tooth into its final position.
- The Ligature, keeps the archwires in the bracket slot.

  Archwires and ligatures are replaced several times over the course of treatment.



**Hygiene:** It is important to maintain excellent oral hygiene with a fixed orthodontic appliance.

Brackets tend to trap food, which

can lead to gingivitis and plaque (tartar) buildup. Brushing in the morning, afternoon and at night is highly recommended.



### **LEGEND** or **LEGEND** mini Rhodium:

Depending on the treatment offered, you can choose between a traditional metal bracket, or a more discreet Rhodium metal bracket. Rhodium brackets are highly aesthetic due to their low reflective matte finish. Your Orthodontist will advise you according to your defined treatment plan.
